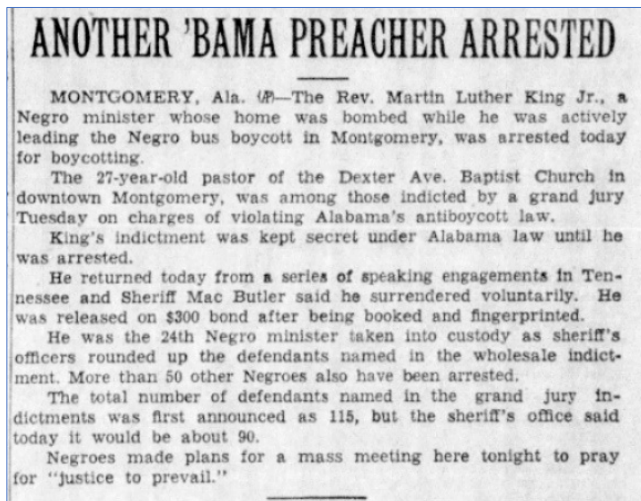

“TAKE A STAND”

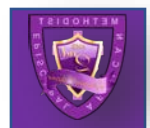

- **REGISTER 10,000 NEW VOTERS**

LOCAL CHURCH GOALS: Beginning Sunday September 16, 2018



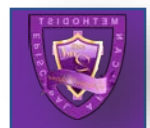
- Each church registers 25 new voters—have members register family members, neighbors, friends
- Register voters every Sunday morning, every Bible study and every Church program— and mail in their forms
- Help people to have proper credentials to vote—prior to start of early voting
- Every church member VOTE during registration, ,
- Provide a sample ballots to church members—As soon as they are available and before early voting begins
- Host a celebration for every completed milestone—**at end of registration, at the close of early voting, and at the get out the vote election day**
- Give young people an opportunity to say why we should vote, how voting affects their lives and what they are doing personally to maximize voter participation
- Advertise your voting event—social media, radio, newsletters, flyers

CLUSTER ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Develop a mission statement for the upcoming midterm elections—Due September 20, 2018
- Conduct phone banks that operate morning, afternoon, and evening—beginning September 21, 2018

Develop plan that includes where phone bank will be held, who will make the phone calls, scheduled time with names—sample table below:

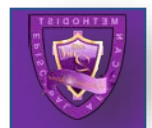

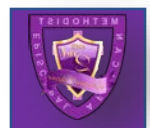

OVERVIEW POLITICAL GUIDELINES

A Church Can:

- Conduct non-partisan voter registration drives
 - Conduct non-partisan voter identification drives
 - Conduct “get-out-the-vote” drives, encouraging members to vote
- 
- Conduct petition drives regarding legislation or other issues
 - Distribute non-partisan voter education information
 - Educate church members on legislative and political matters
 - Discuss doctrine as it applies to politics, legislative matters or candidate positions
 - Introduce political candidates and allow them to address the congregation in their capacity as candidates as long as all candidates seeking the same office are given an equal opportunity to participate, and the church does not express support or opposition for any particular candidate(s).
 - Host candidate forums where all candidates are invited and allowed to speak
 - Lobby on behalf of specific legislation, provided the time spent in this endeavor is "insubstantial" compared to other church activities.
 - Support or oppose political appointments (such as judges or cabinet officials)
 - Make expenditures on behalf of referendums
 - Pastors may endorse candidates as individuals, but not on behalf of a church, (if title and church name are used, include a “title and affiliation for identification purposes only” disclaimer)
 - Discuss issues, provided the discussion does not exhibit preferences for or against specific candidates.
 - Serve as a polling place.
 - Invite a candidate in a non-official capacity, such as for a groundbreaking ceremony, provided the person is not introduced as a candidate, no mention is made of his or her candidacy and the event is not promoted as an appearance by "Candidate X."



A Church Cannot:



- Endorse or campaign for candidates for elected office in the name of the church
- Contribute money or make “in kind” contributions, (such as resources or services), to a candidate, political party or political action committee
- Distribute materials that endorse a particular candidate or political party
- Allow candidates to solicit funds from the congregation (from the pulpit)
- Create a church political committee that would do any of the above
- Openly take sides in an issue, specifically espousing or denouncing the views of any particular candidate.
- Raise money for a candidate or political party or contribute to a political campaign.

Clergy Members Can

- Clergy members may take sides for or against a candidate or issue if they are doing so as a private individual, not as a church representative. They may not use the pulpit, church publications or any other forum related to the church to declare their individual preferences.

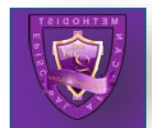

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS

- **Auditors** track monies (collected from taxes and federal or state funding) to ensure they are spent legally and responsibly—guard against fraud and/or error
- **City council/County council** represent residents of wards or districts—they hear concerns and issues of their constituents and work with other members of council to meet needs of each community to the extent possible
- **County assessors** help property owners in a given county determine its value -- and, in turn, the county's property tax rate.
- **County clerk office** you've ever gotten married, had a child or really, ever been born, your vital records have made their way over to the. Could you work as a county clerk and maintain all that paperwork?



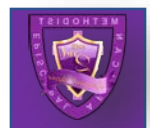
- **County Executive**—oversees executive branch of local government, may have vote on county council or have veto power
- **Mayor**—manage and oversee local government—based on city charter some mayors have oversight of executive departments such as police, health, education, public works (sanitation)—may be very involved in city development
- **Sheriff** oversees and manages local civil law enforcement activities which vary among jurisdictions—issue warrants, eviction notices, traffic control, oversee jails, seizes property, courthouse security
- **School board members** are locally elected public officials entrusted with governing a community's public schools. The **role** of the school **board** is to ensure that school districts are responsive to the values, beliefs and priorities of their communities.
- **State's Attorney** the chief prosecutor responsible for representing the people in criminal and civil legal matters including criminal trials and lawsuits

NORTH CAROLINA

Registration

Eligibility

- U.S. citizen
- 18 years of age, or be 17 years of age and will turn 18 no later than November 6, 2018 (the date of the general election)
- reside in the county and election district in which person presents to vote
- Not serving an active sentence for a felony conviction
- College students can register and vote in the jurisdiction of their residence. **A registered voter may only have one residence.** If the college student considers the school address to be his or her residence, the college student may register and vote in the county where the school is located.

How to register

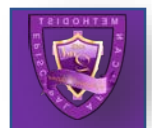
- download and complete printable voter registration form on the State Board of Election's website: www.ncsbe.gov or
- obtain voter registration application at county board of election offices, libraries, high schools, or college admissions offices

Deadline to register: 25 days before the election

(Voter registration forms received by the county board of elections offices or postmarked by the deadline are accepted as valid applications for the upcoming election)

Voting

- Absentee Ballot: any North Carolina registered voter may request an absentee ballot by completing the State Absentee Ballot Request Form available on the State Board of Election's website at: www.ncsbe.gov
- Early Voting
 - One-stop voting or "early voting" is actually in-person absentee voting. The reason it is called one-stop absentee voting is that the voter has an opportunity to request, receive and vote the absentee ballot all at one time.
 - Early voting hours vary by county and location. Voters should check the one-stop absentee schedule in their county to determine specific hours for each early voting site. The schedule



for early voting will be posted by the start of the absentee voting by mail period.

- At the Polls on Election Day
 - The requirement to show a photo ID for voting and other associated laws has been struck down by a Federal court. Photo ID is not required to vote.
 - The voter's polling place information be found on State Board of Election's website at: www.ncsbe.gov through the Voter Lookup tool at <https://www.ncsbe.gov/voter-tools-voter-lookup>
 - Since straight-party voting was eliminated in North Carolina, there will not be an option that allows a voter to use one mark to vote for the candidates of a given party for more than one office. Voters must vote for each partisan contest item separately on the general election ballot.
 - Provisional ballot is offered to voters when there are questions about: a voter's qualification to vote, the voter's eligibility to vote in a given election, or the voter's eligibility to vote a specific ballot style.

Sample ballots for the November 2018 Election are not yet available through the State Board of Elections website, but you may still look up your Election Day precinct.

Follow a four-step process to download your sample ballot and find your Election Day precinct. (Some ballots may not be assigned until later this fall.)

▶#1 — To open the N.C. State Board of Elections Voter Lookup Page Click:

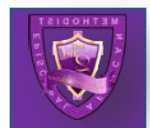

▶#2 — Enter your first and last names as they appear on your voter registration record. Don't enter a middle name. It's not necessary to enter your birth date or county unless you have a very common name. **Click "Search."**

▶#3 — Click on your name to see a profile of your registration, including your precinct's Election Day polling place and the jurisdictions you live in.

▶#4 —On the page with your registration profile, go to the box below the words "Sample Ballot," and click on the letter/number to the right of the current Election date.

Questions, please call **888-OUR-VOTE (888-687-8683)** or the State Board of Elections at 866-522-4723. The best way to avoid confusion (and the risk of bad weather, long lines or other problems on Election Day) is to **vote early at an Early Voting site in your county, where all types of ballots will be available and many registration issues can be solved.**

Vote4DC is a mobile app for the voters of Washington, DC. Vote4DC is available on iOS and Android systems. Vote4DC is fully compatible with iOS and Android phones, tablets, and is designed to assist color-blind users. With Vote4DC, District of Columbia voters can:

- Register to vote directly from the app
- Confirm or update voter registrations
- Request an absentee ballot
- Find information for Military and Overseas Voters (UOCAVA) and submit Absentee Ballot requests electronically
- Find their Election Day polling place or an Early Voting Center
- View ballot information for an upcoming election
- View turn-by-turn directions from their current location or residential address to a polling location
- View polling place hours, election calendars, and create customizable alerts and reminders
- Access information on candidates and ballot measures
- View contact information for local election administrators

Registration

Eligibility

- Be a U.S. citizen.
- Be a Washington, D.C. resident.
- Be at least 18 years old on or before the next election.
- You may pre-register to vote when you are 16 years old.
- You may vote in a primary election if you are at least 17 years old, BUT you must be at least 18 years old by the next general election.
- Not have been adjudged "mentally incompetent" by a court of law.
- Not claim the right to vote anywhere outside D.C.
- Not be currently incarcerated for a felony conviction.

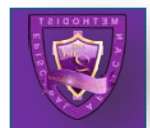

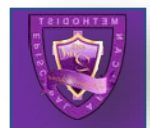


Age Eligibility Quick Facts: You May Register to Vote if You're 16 Years of Age. You May Not Vote Unless You'll be 18 Years of Age by Next General Election: November 6, 2018

- A U.S. citizen;
- A Maryland resident; and
- At least 16 years old (Individuals may register to vote if they are at least 16 years old but cannot vote unless they will be at least 18 years old by the next general election)
- You can use Maryland's Online Voter Registration System (OLVR) <https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/OnlineVoterRegistration/InstructionsStep1> to register to vote or, you may complete a voter registration application in person at:

The process must be finished by 9 pm. To make sure that the registration process is completed by 9 pm, it is suggested that individuals access the system no later than 8:50 pm on the deadline. (October 16, 2018)
- Individuals can register to vote during early voting.

• Early Voting

- Thursday, October 25, 2018 through Thursday, November 1, 2018 from 10 am until 8 pm

• At the Polls on Election Day

- On election day, vote at assigned polling place. If polling place is not known, visit our voter lookup website:
<https://voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/votersearch>
- On election day, polling places are open continuously from 7 am until 8 pm on. Anyone in line at 8 pm will be allowed to vote.
- Employers must give certain employees time off to vote and pay them for their absence. If an employee is a registered voter and does not have two continuous hours off-duty between 7 am and 8 pm on election day, the voter's employer must give the employee two hours to vote and pay the employee for the two-hour absence.
- Voter requirement: If a person is asked to show ID, one of the following forms of ID is acceptable:



- A copy of a current and valid photo ID (i.e., Maryland driver's license, MVA ID card, student, employee, or military ID card,
- U.S. passport, or any other State or federal government-issued ID card);
- A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address.
- Current means that the document is dated within 3 months of the election.

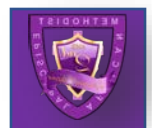

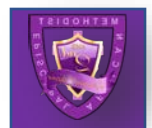
Eligibility

- U.S. citizen, a resident of Virginia
- at least 18 years old by the next general election
- Had voting rights restored if convicted of a felony
- Had capacity restored by court order if declared mentally incapacitated
- Voter registration online: <https://www.elections.virginia.gov/citizen-portal/index.html>
- Deadline to register to vote, or update an existing registration, is Monday, October 15, 2018

- After completing the application, a person will be allowed to vote absentee in-person using a voting machine in the registrar's office. Accessible equipment and/or curbside voting is available upon request.

Voting prior to General Elections

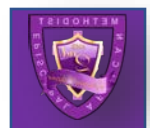
- In person absentee voting. Within 45 days prior to the election in which you wish to vote, visit your local registrar's office to vote absentee in-person. The general registrar's office shall be open a minimum of eight hours between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Dates: 10/27/2018 and 11/3/2018

Election Day

- You will need to show one acceptable photo identification card (photo ID) whenever you vote in person. This is Virginia law for all voters. You only need to show ONE acceptable photo ID to vote. Photo IDs can be used to vote up to one year after the ID has expired.

Acceptable forms of valid identification:

- Virginia driver's license
- Virginia DMV-issued photo ID
- United States passport
- Employer-issued photo ID



- Student photo ID issued by a school, college, or university located in Virginia
- Other U.S. or Virginia government-issued photo ID
- Tribal enrollment or another tribal photo ID
- Virginia Voter Photo ID card

If you don't have an ID, simply go to your nearest **voter registration office** to get a free Voter Photo ID, even on Election Day! You will be required to complete a Photo ID Application:

Virginia Voter Photo ID card is valid for voting purposes only.

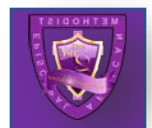
A voter who arrives at the polling place without an acceptable form of photo identification will be given the opportunity to vote a provisional ballot. After completing the provisional ballot, the individual voting will be given written instructions from the election officials on how to submit a **copy** of his/her identification so that his/her vote can be counted.

A voter will have until noon on the Friday following the election to deliver a copy of the identification to the local electoral board. Voters may submit a copy of their ID via fax, email, in-person submission, or through USPS or commercial delivery service.

General Instructions

Who Can Use this Application

If you are a U.S. citizen who lives or has an address within the United States, you can use the application in this booklet to:

- Register to vote in your State,
- Report a change of name to your voter registration office,
- Report a change of address to your voter registration office, or
- Register with a political party.

Exceptions

Please do not use this application if you live outside the United States and its territories and have no home (legal) address in this country, *or* if you are in the military stationed away from home. Use the Federal Postcard Application available to you from military bases, American embassies, or consular offices.

New Hampshire town and city clerks will accept this application only as a request for their own absentee voter mail-in registration form.

North Dakota does not have voter registration.

Wyoming law does not permit mail registration.

How to Find Out If You Are Eligible to Register to Vote in Your State

Each State has its own laws about who may register and vote. Check the information under your State in the State Instructions. All States require that you be a United States citizen by birth or naturalization to register to vote in federal and State elections. Federal law makes it illegal to falsely claim U.S. citizenship to register to vote in any federal, State, or local election. You **cannot** be registered to vote in more than one place at a time.

How to Fill Out this Application

Use both the Application Instructions and State Instructions to guide you in filling out the application.

- First, read the Application Instructions. These instructions will give you important information that applies to everyone using this application.
- Next, find your State under the State Instructions. Use these instructions to fill out Boxes 6, 7, and refer to these instructions for information about voter eligibility and any oath required for Box 9.

When to Register to Vote

Each State has its own deadline for registering to vote. Check the deadline for your State on the last page of this booklet.

How to Submit Your Application

Mail your application to the address listed under your State in the State Instructions. Or, deliver the application in person to your local voter registration office. The States that are required to accept the national form will accept copies of the application printed from the computer image on regular paper stock, signed by the applicant, and mailed in an envelope with the correct postage.

First Time Voters Who Register by Mail

If you are registering to vote for the first time in your jurisdiction and are mailing this registration application, Federal law requires you to show proof of identification the first time you vote. Proof of identification includes:

- A current and valid photo identification or
- A current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or government document that shows your name and address.

Voters may be exempt from this requirement if they submit a **COPY** of this identification with their mail in voter registration form. If you wish to submit a **COPY**, please keep the following in mind:

- Your state may have additional identification requirements which may mandate you show identification at the polling place even if you meet the Federal proof of identification.
- Do not submit original documents with this application, only **COPIES**.

If You Were Given this Application in a State Agency or Public Office

If you have been given this application in a State agency or public office, it is your choice to use the application. If you decide to use this application to register to vote, you can fill it out and leave it with the State agency or public office. The application will be submitted for you. Or, you can take it with you to mail to the address listed under your State in the State Instructions. You also may take it with you to deliver in person to your local voter registration office.

Note: The name and location of the State agency or public office where you received the application will remain confidential. It will not appear on your application. Also, if you decide not to use this application to register to vote, that decision will remain confidential. It will not affect the service you receive from the agency or office.

Application Instructions

Before filling out the body of the form, please answer the questions on the top of the form as to whether you are a United States citizen and whether you will be 18 years old on or before Election Day. If you answer no to either of these questions, you may not use this form to register to vote. However, state specific instructions may provide additional information on eligibility to register to vote prior to age 18.

Box 1 — Name

Put in this box your full name in this order — Last, First, Middle. Do not use nicknames or initials.

Note: If this application is for a change of name, please tell us in **Box A** (*on the bottom half of the form*) your full name before you changed it.

Box 2 — Home Address

Put in this box your home address (legal address). Do **not** put your mailing address here if it is different from your home address. Do **not** use a post office box or rural route without a box number. Refer to state-specific instructions for rules regarding use of route numbers.

Note: If you were registered before but this is the first time you are registering from the address in Box 2, please tell us in **Box B** (*on the bottom half of the form*) the address where you were registered before. Please give us as much of the address as you can remember.

Also Note: If you live in a rural area but do not have a street address, or if you have no address, please show where you live using the map in Box C (*at the bottom of the form*).

Box 3 — Mailing Address

If you get your mail at an address that is different from the address in Box 2, put your mailing address in this box. If you have no address in Box 2, you **must** write in Box 3 an address where you can be reached by mail.

Box 4 — Date of Birth

Put in this box your date of birth in this order — Month, Day, Year. *Be careful not to use today's date!*

Box 5 — Telephone Number

Most States ask for your telephone number in case there are questions about your application. However, you do not have to fill in this box.

Box 6 — ID Number

Federal law requires that states collect from each registrant an identification number.
