	MAKE SURE WE PLACE THE ELECTION IN THE HANDS OF GOD BY SEEKING HIS GUIDANCE 7 DAYS OF PRAYER BEFORE THE ELECTION (10/27/20)
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS HAVE COMPLETED THE 2020 CENSUS DEADLINE SEPTEMBER 30th (Get Counted today online at www.census2020.gov)
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS ARE REGISTERED TO VOTE (Register to vote today online at 866 ourvote.org or at Vote411.org)
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS CONFIRM THEIR VOTER REGISTRATION (Go to canivote.org, or calling the Election Protection Hotline at 866.0UR.VOTE)
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS VERIFY POLLING PLACE (Go online at canivote.org, or calling the Election Protection Hotline at 866.0UR.VOTE.)
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS KNOW what kind of identification to bring on Election Day at canivote.org or by calling 866.0UR.VOTE.
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS ARE INFORMED ABOUT ABSENTEE BALLOT LAWS (Every state offers some form of mail-in ballots.)
	MAKE SURE ALL MEMBERS ARE FAMILIAR WITH THE VOTING BALLOT (Request a sample ballot from local election office)
✓	GET OUT THE VOTE PREPARATION
	ORGANIZE INFORMATION TEAM to collect all pertinent voting information for distribution
	ORGANIZE TECHNOLOGY TEAM to share voting information on all social media platform (Mailout, FaceBook, Instagram, Website, etc.)
	ORGANIZE PHONE BANK TEAM to call the church membership to check their voter registration status and early voting
	ORGANIZE TRANSPORTATION TEAM to provide rides to the poll
	ORGANIZE HOSPITALITY TEAM to collect and prepare items to pass out on Election Day (Water, FaceMask, Hand Sanitizer, etc.)
	ORGANIZE VOLUNTEER TEAM to canvas the polls and pass out essential items to the voters in lines
✓	ELECTION DAY - NOVEMBER 3, 2020 - VOTE! VOTE! VOTE!
	PHONE TEAM - Make early morning calls to those signed up for rides to the poll
	PROVIDE A CALL-IN PHONE NUMBER for those that may need assistance during the day
	TRANSPORTATION TEAM - Make sure your vehicles are insured, serviced and ready to take voters to the poll
	HOSPITALITY TEAM - Make sure all essential items are ready for the volunteers to pick up
	VOLUNTEER TEAM - Make sure all volunteers are wearing protective gear and ready to assist voters with essential items
	ELECTION DAY PROBLEMS? - Report an election problem by calling 1-866-687-8683 (1-866-OUR-VOTE)
√	A REMINDER LIST TO SHARE - GET READY TO VOTE!
	Fill out your US Census Form and Remind you family and friends to fill out the Census Form TODAY!
	REGISTER TO VOTE! Check your voter registration! It's always good to check the information your local election official has on file for you.
	Make it a community affair by ensuring your family and friends are prepared to vote.
	Learn about early and mail-in voting opportunities in your state. If you're eligible to vote by mail in your state, request your ballot by mail early!
	Encourage your family and friends to request their mail-in ballot as early as possible if they're eligible to vote by mail in their state.
	Return your ballot as soon as you can. Don't forget to sign and seal it, as required and make sure you added enough postage. RETURN BY DEADLINE!
	Check VOTE411 to find your polling location, if you'll be voting in person.
	Check if you need an ID to vote. Some states require it.
	If you are voting in person, make an Election Day plan. Find your polling place. Decide when you're voting and how you're getting there.
	BECOME A POLL WORKER ou can help FIGHT voter suppression. Get off the sidelines and sign up to staff your local polling place.
